Louisiana Flood 2016



Louisiana experienced nearly 36 inches of record-breaking rainfall between August 11th and August 15, 2016. The resulting flood has been a physical and economic disaster for Southern Louisiana. It has become known as the "thousand year flood" because many of the affected areas have historically never flooded. It is estimated that only about 25 percent of the homes and businesses affected were covered by flood insurance.
